## Doggie Rules: Wood Farm Cottages

Your dog is very welcome at Wood Farm! To keep things working smoothly for all our guests, please follow our eight Doggie Rules.

## In your cottage:

- 1 Clean off and dry your dog in the tiled lobby area. You'll find a dog wash station on the wall near the car park to rinse off the worst of any mud. Let your lobby get dirty so the rest of your cottage can stay clean!
- 2 Dogs are not allowed in the bedrooms but are allowed on the sofas in the lounge *if* the sofa has first been well covered by a thick blanket which you'll need to bring with you. All our cottages have leather sofas so please take care that your dog's paws don't scratch the leather. Please use stair gates in the cottages where provided to help control where dogs can wander.
- 3 Please make every effort to find dog friendly destinations, but if this is not possible, you may leave your dog unaccompanied in the cottage, ideally in a crate. **This must be agreed in advance**, and your dog must not be given free run of the cottage. We regret that dogs that bark continuously are not allowed at Wood Farm.
- 4 If you have friends or family staying in a different cottage and you've only paid for a dog in your cottage then please make sure that your dog does not visit the other cottages. Nb Oak and Elm are dog free cottages.
- 5 Please thoroughly clean the cottage, including dog hair from rugs and carpets before you leave; if properties require additional cleaning, or dogs have been in the bedrooms or an uncovered sofa, we will charge a £50 fee to cover the cost.

## Around Wood Farm:

- 6 Your dog should be **always** be kept on the lead in the courtyard and on the Play Park, this means keeping them on the lead when you arrive and when first set out for your walk.
- 7 Elsewhere on our site if there is a chance that your dog will jump up at other guests or run up to guests and bark then please be considerate and keep your dog on a lead. Your dog can be let off the lead on the two-field walk if you're keeping a close eye on him/her and you're confident that you're in control of him/her. You must obey the Countryside Code and keep your dog under close control at all times for their own safety as well as for the benefit of other dog owners and livestock.
- 8 Poop control! Clear up after your dog at all times bag and bin all dog poo, please to keep things clean and safe for all our guests. This includes in the private gardens of Rowan and Holly cottages.
